Use *articles* for time-sensitive content like news, press releases or blog posts.

**Basic page**  
Use *basic pages* for your static content, such as an 'About us' page.

**Conference**  
Publish a Conference

**Front slideshow image**  
Publish a frontpage slideshow image and text.

**Newsletter**  
A newsletter issue to be sent to subscribed email addresses.

**Opportunity**  
Publish an *opportunity*, eg Education Opportunity, Student Opportunity, Position Vacant etc

**Webform**  
Create a new form or questionnaire accessible to users. Submission results and statistics are recorded and accessible to privileged users.

**Creating News Items - page 2**

#1. Enter the title  
 #2. Tags may be applicable to this article. You will be told if they are to be used.  
 #3 Body text can be copied from office documents. However for consistency very little formatting is usually best. If you find yourself trying to clean up content pasted from an office document, copy the content into a text editor (e.g. notepad) first to remove any unwanted formatting.  
 #4 Images can be loaded into the content area. The image that is used for thumbnails (#6) is uploaded here. The system will scale the image, but smaller images are faster to upload.  
 #5 Don't forget to to push "Save". This will add your work to the site and all indexes.


